

a social service report by the social service worker; there will be evaluated test data with intake interview impression summaries; a recreation adjustment report from the recreation supervisor; a custodial adjustment report from the custodial officer in charge of the inmate's housing unit; infraction reports, if any, and such other information as may become available through investigation, referral, and family contacts. This systematic design is intended to treat the individual in terms of a whole-life situation, rather than an isolated temporary detention situation.

PERSONNEL TRAINING PROGRAM

A training program is in effect for custodial officers, seminarians, and graduate students in social work and related fields. In the past year the following schools have been represented: New York University, Columbia University Teacher's College and Union Theological Seminary. These students, doing field work under the supervision of the Director of the Youth Guidance Program, receive academic credit for this work toward their Master's and Doctorate degrees. In turn, the Department of Correction receives services of qualified, interested and mature students through this training operation. An expansion of this program is presently in the offing.

The custodial officer training program is designed to give correction officers insight in the field of inter-personal relations for the development of an understanding approach in the daily contact between officers and inmates. Furthermore, such a program will eventually culminate in the development of a custodial staff effectively trained and qualified to promote a therapeutic atmosphere through a knowledge of psychological data and provide a more effective team service in the administration of detention units.

AFTER-CARE AND FAMILY SERVICES

In this area of personality re-orientation or guidance and counseling, another very serious deficiency still remains. This is the area called *After-Care and Family Services*. That is, the continuation of the therapeutic process with treatable inmates with good prognosis after their release from detention and the extension of the present services to the inmate's family, while the inmate is incarcerated in our custody for treatment.

For this purpose it is proposed that we be enabled to implement said services on a pilot basis with the present Youth Guidance and Counseling unit serving as the core of this operation.
