Notes

- Figures are approximate and typical. Actual numbers will vary from day to day.
- Educational and recreational films are shown in the chapel approximately once a week, between October and April, in place of the morning or evening recreation period, on a rotating schedule, so that all floors get to see the film during the course of the week.
- Day Room recreation consists of quiet games, reading, and television; it involves all inmates not participating in a regularly scheduled activity, hence, the number involved vary widely.
- Number of inmates involved varies widely from day to day.

- 5. During the summer months, all groups scheduled for afternoon and evening recreation, go to the roof; during the winter months, half go to the chapel for film programs.
- 6. A number of activities take place throughout the course of the day, on a variable schedule, with each floor, in turn, serviced — mobile library, commissary, clothing exchange; or between regularly scheduled activities — haircuts, additional showers, etc.
- Meetings of "Narcotics Anonymous" take place each Sunday at 10:00 A.M.; "Alcoholics Anonymous" meet each Sunday at 12:45 P.M.
