

The physician should be required to keep a record in ink at the jail, showing time of visit, patient or patients treated, their condition, and treatment prescribed.

In case a prisoner is in such state of bodily health that he requires immediate medical or surgical treatment, he may be removed to a hospital by order of the county judge. The prisoner is to be "kept in the custody of the officials in charge of the jail to which he is committed until he has sufficiently recovered from his illness to be safely returned to the jail." The Sheriff, warden or jailer is then to be notified by the chief officer of the hospital that the prisoner has recovered, when he is to be returned to the jail to which he is committed. (Section 508—Correction Law)

When the security of the jail yard permits, prisoners should have a reasonable amount of exercise daily in the open, weather permitting.
